The Bible by far is the greatest and best selling book ever written. In 2015 The Guinness Book of World Records stated that the Bible is the best selling book of all time with over 5 billion copies sold and distributed worldwide. The British and Foreign Bible Society in 2021 suggests that the total number probably lies between 5 and 7 billion copies. Unfortunately, the second most published book in the world is the Quran with over 800 million copies printed. Paling in comparison is the Book of Mormon. As of 2020 there were more than 192 million copies of the Book of Mormon printed. The good news is far more people are purchasing the Holy Bible than the Quran and the Book of Mormon combined. However that doesn't necessarily equate to people actually reading the Bible much less fully understanding what they have read. Sadly, far too many Bibles are setting on coffee tables, night stands, or hidden out of sight gathering dust instead of being opened and read. I am baffled as to why so many people refuse to open the Bible much less read the Bible. You would think everyone would want to read the greatest book ever written, especially Christians.

In this wicked and sinful world that we live in, there are many people who are being manipulated and led astray by false prophets. Jesus warned us about such people. There are dozens of such warnings in various Scripture passages. I will quote a few of those passages.

- Matthew 7:15 "Beware of false prophets which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves".
- Matthew 24:11 "And many false prophets will arise and lead many astray".
- 1 Timothy 6:5 "And constant friction among people who are depraved in mind and deprived of the truth, imagining that godliness is a means of gain".
- 2 Timothy 4:3-4 "For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths".
- Acts 20:29 "I know that after my departure fierce wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock."
- John 14:6 Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

It is crystal clear that the numerous Scripture passages about false prophets are warning us to be aware of them and not to let yourself fall prey to their false teachings. It is much easier for someone to fall prey when they are not always sure what the Word of God says.

So what can we do that will help us to distinguish between Biblical truths and nonbiblical teachings (falsehoods). God's Holy Word is our one and only source of truth when it comes to His teachings. He has told us everything we need to know. His Holy Word requires no detours and no additional instructions. The road map that He laid out for us is perfect and truthful in every way. It is 100 percent complete and 100 percent factual. As Christians we should make God the number one priority in our life and thus we should spend time praying and reading His Holy Word each day. We should let God's Word strengthen us and renew us not just on Sunday morning but everyday of the week. We should not only read it, but we should live by it and obey it in all that we do. The more we understand His Word the better equipped we are in recognizing the non-biblical teachings of false prophets. But even our daily Bible reading at home is not enough. We need to hear the Word of God preached by Pastor Williams and to dive deeper into the Word by attending Pastor Williams Bible Study. The more we read the Word of God, the more we hear the Word of God, the more we study the Word of God, the more we will understand the Word of God, and the more that we understand the Word of God the better equipped we will be at identifying and rebuking false prophets and their non-biblical teachings. Let us gather together not only in church but also in Bible Study after church. You will not only enjoy the fellowship but you will be amazed at how much you learn as we dive deeper into God's Holy Word with Pastor Williams at the helm.





Lutherans for Life

Greetings in the name of Jesus, protected and cared for by His earthly father Joseph,

As we observe Father's Day this month, it is important to acknowledge and celebrate the critical role of fathers in the life of the family and especially their children. Unfortunately, some fathers are forgotten as will be seen in the excerpts from the following article by Jean Amundson entitled Don't Forget the Men!:

"Don't forget the men!" This is a phrase heard frequently from post-abortive men.

"In many situations, when the birth father is made aware of the abortion, he is devastated. He wonders why he was not made aware of the pregnancy and why the birth mom decided to abort the pregnancy. ... After participating on a panel at a Lutherans For Life conference a few years ago, a man came up to me and said, "Don't forget the men." He shared that his girlfriend had an abortion and didn't tell him about it until quite a while afterward. He was crushed.... Another time a man cried in my arms---it was quite emotional. He said several years ago he had a girlfriend who was pregnant with his child who chose to abort it.... A post-abortive grandfather shared that when his daughter was a teenager, she became pregnant. His wife and daughter chose to abort the baby over his objection. He is still grieving for the loss of the grandchild he never knew.....

"Don't forget the men!" God doesn't and neither should we!" (Jean Amundsen, retired LFL Regional Director of Texas, LifeDate Fall 2019)

God calls fathers to be protectors and defenders of the family. In a "National Review" article some time ago, Pope Francis recognized the importance of fathers by asking what about the man? What are his responsibilities? What should we expect of him? What should he be living up to? Pope Francis suggests Joseph is a model of a guardian who protects mother and child. Also, in answer to those questions, there's a rallying cry letter to men by

Bishop Thomas J. Olmsted, of Phoenix, called "Into the Breach". Bishop Olmsted calls his letter a "clarion call and clear charge". He writes:

"Men, do not hesitate to engage in the battle that is raging around you, the battle that is wounding our children and families, the battle that is distorting the dignity of both women and men. This battle is often hidden, but the battle is real."

"He points to Joseph in emphasizing that fatherhood does nothing short of changing history. In the Gospel according to Matthew, he notes that where "Abraham was the father of Isaac, and Isaac the father of Jacob, and Jacob the father of Judah and his brothers," there were (42) fathers who lead up to Joseph, the adoptive father of Jesus. He quotes John Paul II about the essential nature of fatherhood:

"In revealing and in reliving on earth the very fatherhood of God (cf. Eph 3:15), a man is called upon to ensure the harmonious and united development of all the members of the family: he will perform this task by exercising generous responsibility for the life conceived under the heart of the mother, by a more solicitous commitment to education, a task he shares with his wife, by work which is never a cause of division in the family but promotes its unity and stability." (National Review, 2021)

Let's remember and celebrate fathers and encourage them in the roll to which God has called them!

What Do You Have That You Have Not Received?

Some of the disciples of John the Baptist were questioning him about the baptism and preaching of Jesus. John the Baptist replies to their questions in this way: "A person cannot receive even one thing unless it is given him from heaven" (John 3:27).

Now, John the Baptist says this to show that Jesus, His teaching, and His baptism are from heaven. But this statement is true of everything – everything that we have and are in body and soul. In fact, this is what we are taught in the meaning of the

Apostles' Creed in Luther's Small Catechism.

In the explanation of the Creed's First Article, we learn that God has made us and everything in the universe. Luther says:

"He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them. He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life. He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil. All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him."

In the Second Article of the Creed, we learn that God sent His Son, Jesus, to humble Himself, taking the form of a servant. Luther writes:

"(Jesus) has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity."

In the Third Article of the Creed, we learn that the fruits of what Jesus Christ, the Son of God, did are given to us through the work of the Holy Spirit in the Church. Luther explains:

"That I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. In this Christian church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers. On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ."

Indeed, a person cannot receive even one thing unless it is given him from heaven. But how easy is this for us to forget about this?

How easy is it for us to think that what we have in this life is because we have earned it? How easy is it for us to forget that even all our skills, the abilities of our hands and minds – the very ethic to work diligently and to seek to get better at these skills – is given to us from heaven, just as John the Baptist said? How easy is it for us to forget that it is Christ alone – and the work of the Holy Spirit – that reveals His salvation to us, delivers it to us, and not our doing?

Sure, we have responsibility for coming to church, for delving into God's Holy Word, and for praying without ceasing. But even these responsibilities are given to us from heaven, not to earn anything but in response to what He has accomplished for us.

A person cannot receive one thing unless it is given to him from heaven. Everything we have, and everything we are – in both body and soul – are gifts from God in heaven. Let us then respond in thanksgiving and give back to Him as He asks us to – with a first-fruits, generous proportion offering of what He has given to us.
