

Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome

to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

Communion Note: For those who need assistance with the cup please hold out your hand and the Elder will hand it to you. *Please place cup in buckets at end of rail when finished*.



We Walk by Faith, and Not by Sight, in the Peace of Christ's Forgiveness

Habakkuk 1:1-4; 2:1-4 ~ 2 Timothy 1:1-14 ~ Luke 17:1-10 We are surrounded by "destruction and violence" (Hab. 1:3) because the Law "is paralyzed, and justice never goes forth" (Hab. 1:4). In fact, the Law cannot rescue us from our enemies; it is our fiercest enemy of all. Therefore, not by sight, experience or feeling, nor by works, "the righteous shall live by his faith" (Hab. 2:4). "Temptations to sin are sure to come" (Luke 17:1), but as often as we sin, the Lord rebukes us, turns us to repentance and forgives us. We pray that He would thus "increase our faith" (Luke 17:5). And indeed, He does! Though we are His "unworthy servants" (Luke 17:10), He prepares His Supper for us, dresses us properly and gives us His body and blood to eat and drink. He appoints pastors for us, "by the will of Gospel brings "life and immortality to light" (2 Tim. 1:10). This we believe. Therefore, "follow the pattern of the sound words that you have heard," by which He guards you "in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus" (2 Tim. 1:13).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Habakkuk 1:1-4; 2:1-4

This is the revelation seen by the prophet Habakkuk. LORD, how long do I have to call for help while You don't listen? I cry to you, "Violence!" and You don't save us. Why do you let me see wrongdoing? Why do You watch misery? Before me is plundering

and crime; quarreling starts and fighting continues. So the law is a dead letter, and no just decree is ever carried out. The wicked hold the righteous in check; and so just decrees are perverted. I will stand as a watchman. I will stand on the wall and watch to see what He says to me and what answer I will get to my complaint. He answered me and said: "Write the vision, inscribe it clearly on tablets so that a runner may read it. The vision is waiting for the time set when it is to be carried out. It longs for fulfillment and can't fail to come true. If it seems slow, just wait for it because *it will* certainly *happen and not be late.* Look at the proud fellow whose soul is not right within him. *But the righteous person will live by his faith.*

EPISTLE LESSON

2 Timothy 1:1-14

PAUL, APOSTLE OF CHRIST JESUS, by the will of God Who has promised life in Christ Jesus, to Timothy, my dear son – God the Father and Christ Jesus, our Lord, give you grace, mercy, and peace! I thank God – whom I, like my fathers, serve with a clear conscience – when I remember you in my prayers, as I never fail to do day and night. Remembering your tears, I long to see you and so to be filled with happiness. I recall how sincere your faith was; just as it lived in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice before you, so I am convinced it is in you too. That is why I remind you to stir into a flame God's gift that is in you through the laying on of my hands. God didn't give us a cowardly spirit but a Spirit of power and love and good judgment. So don't be ashamed to tell about our Lord, and don't be ashamed of me, His prisoner, but with God's power to back us, join me in suffering for the good news. He saved us and called us to be holy, not because we did anything, but because He planned a gift of His grace and gave it to us in Christ Jesus before the world began; it has now come to light by the coming of our Savior Christ Jesus. He took away the power of death and by the good news brought into the light the life that can't be destroyed. To tell about it, I was appointed a preacher, apostle, and teacher. That is why I suffer as I do, but I'm not ashamed, because I know Him whom I trust, and I'm sure He can keep for that day what I have entrusted to Him. With a faith and a love in Christ Jesus keep what you heard me say as an example of sound teaching. With the help of the Holy Spirit living in us, guard the good thing entrusted to you.

You won't thank the slave for doing what he was ordered to do, will you? So you too, when you've done all you were ordered to do, say 'We are slaves who claim no credit. We've only done our duty.'"




