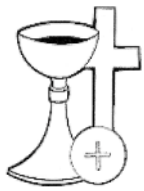

Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

God Manifests His Glory in the Body of Christ Jesus, Transfigured for Us by His Cross

Exodus 24:8–18 ~ 2 Peter 1:16–21 ~ Matthew 17:1–9

The Transfiguration confirms *“the prophetic word ... to which you will do well to pay attention as to a lamp shining in a dark place”* (2 Peter 1:19). The divine glory of Jesus is manifested in the word of His apostles, who were *“eyewitnesses of his majesty”* (2 Peter 1:16). *“He was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun”* (Matt. 17:2). Moses and Elijah

witnessed the fulfillment of the Old Testament in this Lord Jesus, and the Father testified concerning Him: *“This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased”* (Matt. 17:5). By His own blood, shed on the cross, Jesus makes and seals the new covenant with us. Hence, *“the appearance of the glory of the LORD”* is no longer *“like a devouring fire”* (Ex. 24:17), but it is graciously revealed in His own body. As *“Aaron, Nadab, and Abihu, and seventy of the elders of Israel”* went up the mountain with Moses and *“beheld God, and ate and drank”* (Ex. 24:9, 11), we also behold the Lord our God in Christ Jesus, and we abide with Him as we eat and drink His body and blood at the altar.

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Exodus 24:8-18

Then *Moses took the blood and threw it over the people, saying: “Here is the blood of the covenant the LORD made with you on the basis of all He said here.”* Moses went up with Aaron, Nadab, Abihu, and 70 elders of Israel. They saw the God of Israel, and under His feet there was a kind of pavement of sapphire as clear as the sky. God didn't hurt the leaders of Israel while they had a vision of Him and ate and drank. *“Come up to Me on the mountain,”* the LORD told Moses, *“and wait there, and I will give you the stone tablets with the law and the commandments I have written, so that you may teach them.”* Moses and Joshua, his assistant, got up, and Moses went up on God's mountain. He told the elders: *“Wait here for us till we come back to you. Aaron and Hur are here with you. If anyone has a problem, he may go to them.”* Moses went up on the mountain, which was covered by the cloud; the LORD's glory rested on Mount Sinai. For six days the cloud covered it, and on the seventh He called to Moses from the cloud. *The LORD's glory* looked to the Israelites like a consuming fire on the top of the mountain. Moses went into the cloud and up on the mountain. And Moses stayed on the mountain 40 days and 40 nights.

EPISTLE LESSON

2 Peter 1:16-21

We didn't follow any clever myths when we told you about the power of our Lord Jesus Christ and His coming. No, with our own eyes we saw His majesty. God the Father gave

Him honor and glory when from His wonderful glory He said to Him: “*This is My Son Whom I love and with Whom I am delighted.*” We heard that voice speak to Him from heaven when we were with Him on the holy mountain. And we have, as something more sure, the prophetic Word. Please look to it as to a light shining in a dark place until the day dawns and the *Morning Star rises* in your hearts. Understand this first, that no prophecy of Scripture came as some private explanation. For no prophecy was ever spoken because a man decided to prophecy, but men said what God gave them to say as they were directed by the Holy Spirit.

Matthew 17:1-9

Listen to Him!*” When the disciples heard this, they fell facedown; they were terrified. But Jesus came and touched them. “Get up,” He said, “and don't be afraid.” They looked up and saw no one but Jesus. On their way down the mountain Jesus ordered them, “Don't tell anyone what you have seen until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.”

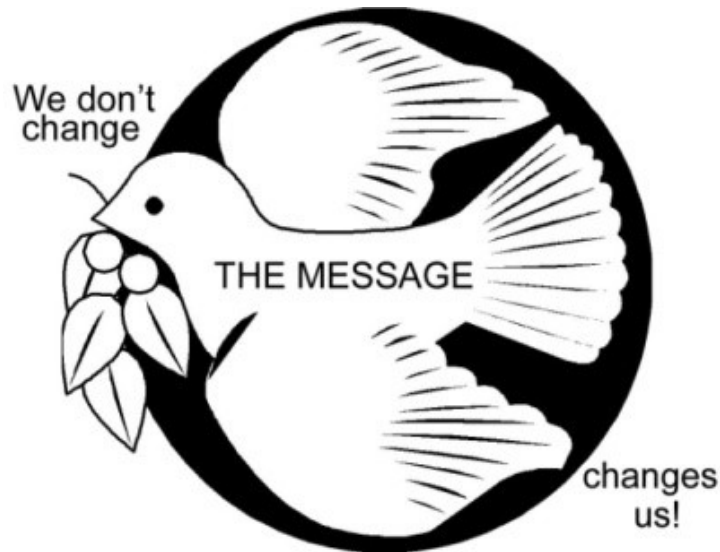
