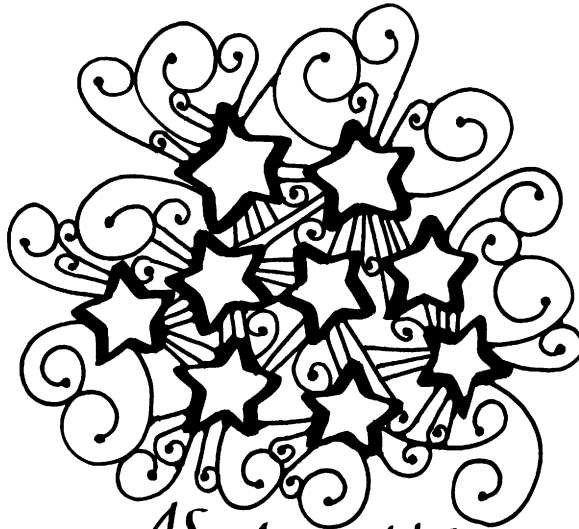

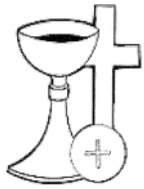

Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

Communion Note: For those who need assistance with the cup please hold out your hand and the Elder will hand it to you. Please place cup in buckets at end of rail when finished.

Christ the Crucified Comes to Save Us by the Word of Faith

The Lord who *"laid the foundation of the earth"* (Job 38:4) is the Author and Giver of life who governs all things by His Word. His wisdom and power are beyond our understanding, except as He reveals Himself in the incarnate Word, Christ Jesus. He has *"entered into the springs of the sea"* and *"walked in the recesses of the deep"* (Job 38:16), and He draws near to us in mercy. We have been *"a long way from the land, beaten by the waves"* and tossed about by hostile winds (Matt. 14:24). In our mortality and sinful unbelief, we do not always recognize the Lord Jesus. But as we cry out in fear, He speaks tenderly to us, *"Do not be afraid,"* and He reaches out His hand to save us (Matt. 14:27, 31). *"Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved"* (Rom. 10:13), and now we call upon Him in faith, because we have heard *"through the word of Christ"* (Rom. 10:17). *"The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart"* (Rom. 10:8).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Job 38:4-18

Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me if you understand. Who determined its measurements - you surely know! Or who stretched a measuring line over it? On what were the sockets of its pillars placed; who laid its cornerstone, while the morning stars sang together and all the sons of God shouted for joy? Who shut in the sea with doors when it broke through and came out of the womb, when I made the clouds its garment and dark clouds its baby clothes; when I prescribed

its shoreline, and set up bars and doors, and said, 'You may come this far but no farther, here your surging waves will stop?'

Did you ever in your life give orders to the morning, or send the dawn to its place, so it could take hold of the earth by its borders and shake the wicked out of it? The earth changes like clay under a seal; parts of it stand out like folds in a garment. The light of the wicked is taken away; his raised arm is broken. Have you gone to the sources of the sea or walked through the hidden recesses of the deep? Were you shown the gates of death; have you looked at the gates of deep darkness? Do you realize how broad the earth is? Tell me if you know it all.

EPISTLE LESSON

Romans 10:5-17

Moses writes: "If you have done the righteous things demanded by the Law, you will find life in them." But the righteousness you receive by faith says this: "Don't ask yourself who will go up to heaven?" which means to bring Christ down, or, "Who will go down into the depths?" which means, to bring Christ up from the dead. But what does it say? "The Word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart." This is the Word of faith that we preach. If with your mouth you confess, "Jesus is the Lord," and in your heart you believe "God raised Him from the dead," you will be saved. With your heart you believe and become righteous; with your mouth you confess and are saved. "Anyone who believes in Him," the Bible says, "will not be disappointed." There is no difference between Jew and Greek, because they all have the same Lord, Who gives His riches to all who call on Him. "Everyone who calls on the Lord's name will be saved."

But how can they call on Him if they haven't believed in Him? How can they believe in Him if they haven't heard of Him? How can they hear if no one preaches? How can men preach if they're not sent? Just as the Bible says: "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!"

But not all have obeyed the good news. Isaiah asks: "Lord, who has believed what we told them?"

So then faith comes from hearing the message, and the message comes through the Word of Christ.

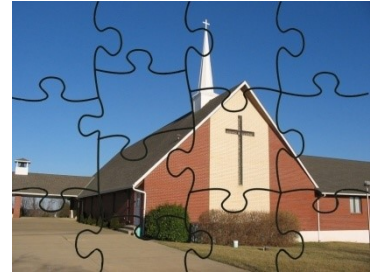

All ages are welcome so bring your dish (and your puzzling mind) and enjoy the company of friends!

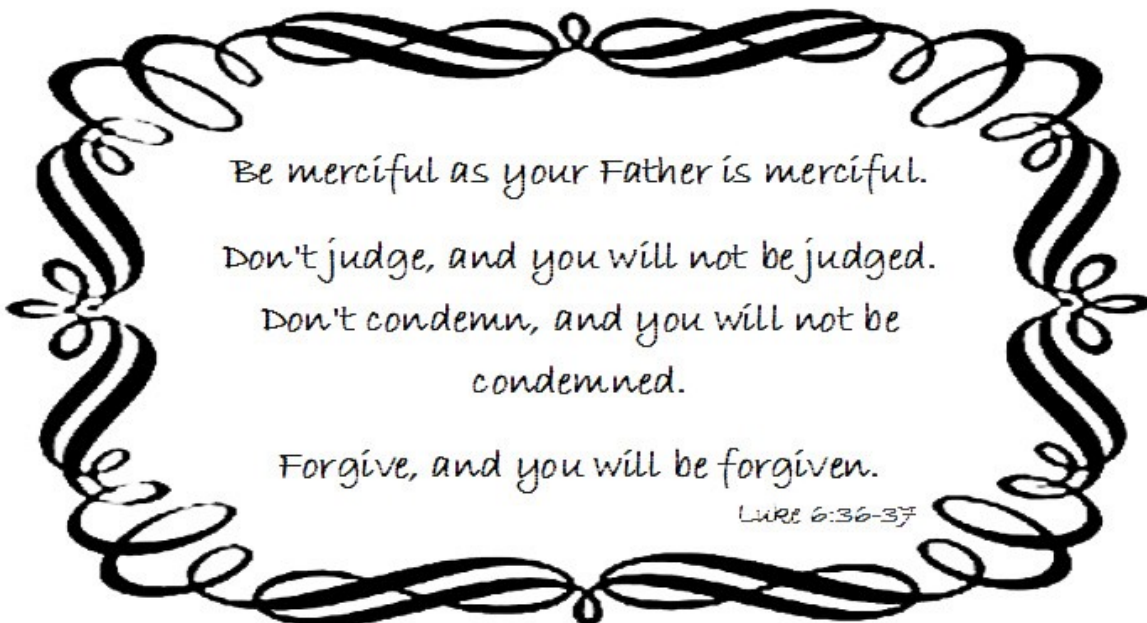
