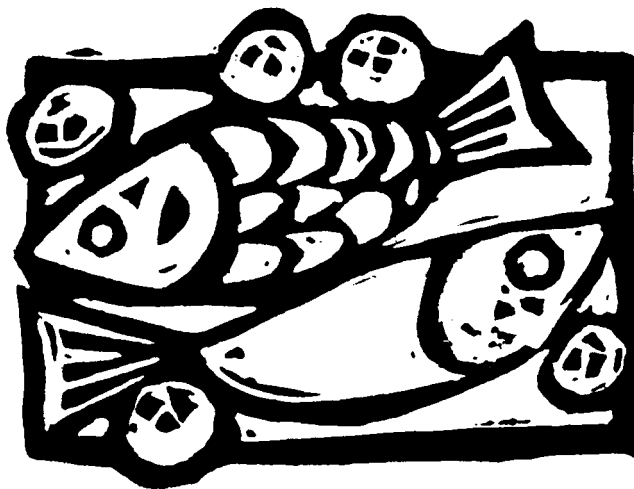

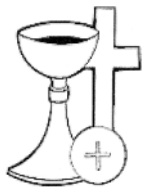

As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. ### ***Christ Jesus, the Living Bread from Heaven, Feeds the Children of God***

By the Gospel of *"the Christ, who is God over all, blessed forever"* (Rom. 9:5), we are *"the children of God"* (Rom. 9:8), *"not because of works but because of him who calls"* (Rom. 9:11). Therefore, *"listen diligently"* and *"hear, that your soul may live."* By His sacrificial death in His flesh and blood, He has made *"an everlasting covenant"* for us. Since He now calls us to Himself, we come to Him *"and eat what is good, and delight ... in rich food"* (Is. 55:2–3). He has come with divine compassion to save us from sin and death and to feed us with Himself. As our Lord Jesus once took bread, *"said a blessing,"* broke the loaves, *"and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds"* (Matt. 14:18–19), He also now takes bread, blesses it by His Word to be His very body, and distributes it to His Church by the hand of His called and ordained servants. Just as *"they took up twelve baskets full of the broken pieces,"* there is more than enough for His whole Church to eat and to be satisfied (Matt. 14:20).

*Isaiah 55:1-5*

*"Oh, come to the water, all you who are thirsty! You who have no money, come, buy and eat. Come and buy grain without money, and wine and milk that costs nothing. Why are you spending money for what isn't bread and your earnings for what doesn't satisfy? If you will only listen to Me, you will eat good things and enjoy rich food. Hear and come to Me. Listen and you will live! I will make an everlasting covenant with you—the mercies faithfully promised to David! Once I made him a witness to the nations, a prince and a commander of the nations. ## EPISTLE LESSON

*Romans 9:1-5 (6-13)*

I'm telling the truth in Christ; I'm not lying, as my conscience assures me by the Holy Spirit, when I say I have a great sorrow and continuous pain in my heart. I could wish myself cut off from Christ and damned for my fellow Jews, my own flesh and blood. They are the people of Israel. They were made God's family. They have the glory, the covenant, the Law, the worship, and the promises. They have the ancestors, and from them according to His body came Christ, Who is God over everything, blessed forever. Amen.

It doesn't mean God failed to do what He said. Not all who are descended from Israel are the real Israel, and not all who are descended from Abraham are for that reason his real children. No, *"Isaac's children will be called your descendants."* This means children born in a natural way are not God's children. Only the children he had because God promised them are counted his descendants.

God promised: *"I will come back at the right time, and Sarah will have a son."* The same thing happened to Rebekah. She was going to bear children for our ancestor Isaac. They had not been born yet nor done anything good or bad. Even then - in order that God may carry out His purpose according to His choice, which doesn't depend on anything we do but on Him Who calls us she was told: *"The older will serve the younger."* And so the Bible says: *"I loved Jacob, but I hated Esau."*

Send the crowds away to the villages to buy themselves some food." "They don't need to go away," Jesus answered them. "You give them something to eat." "All we have here are five loaves and two fish," they told Him. "Let Me have them," He said. He ordered the people to sit down on the grass. Then taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, He blessed them. Breaking the loaves, He gave them to the disciples, and they gave them to the people. All of them ate and had enough. They picked up the pieces that were left—twelve baskets full. Some 5,000 men had eaten, not counting women and children.

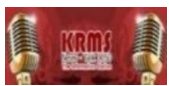

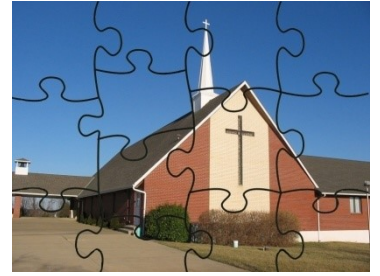

Sunday, August 27<sup>th</sup> following Bible Class. Bring a side dish or dessert to share and prepare to race through some puzzles!

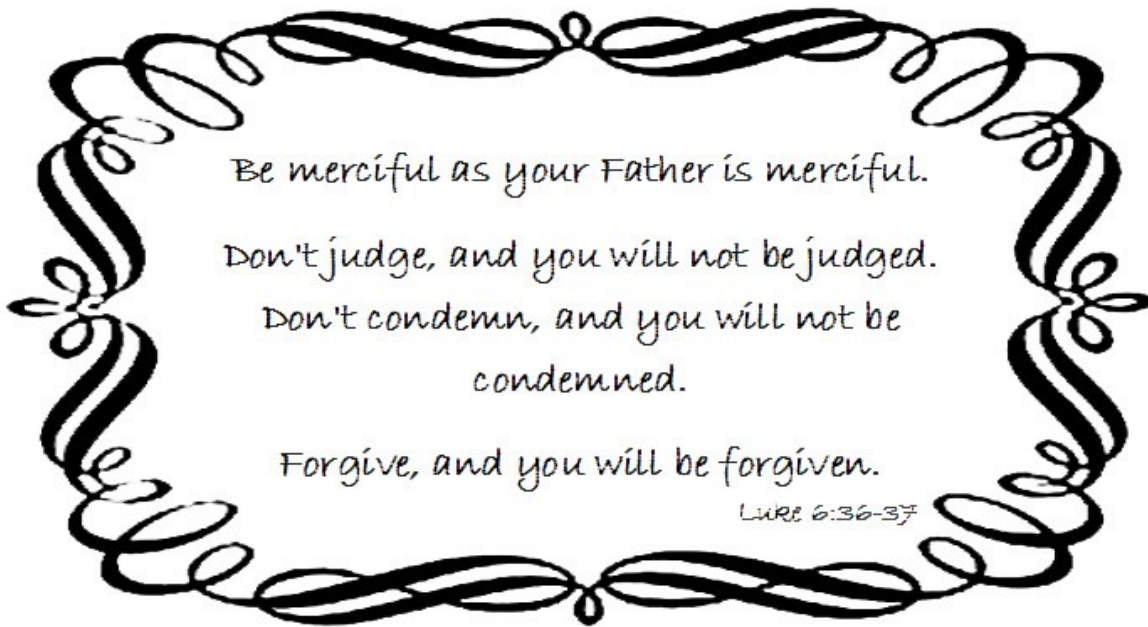
