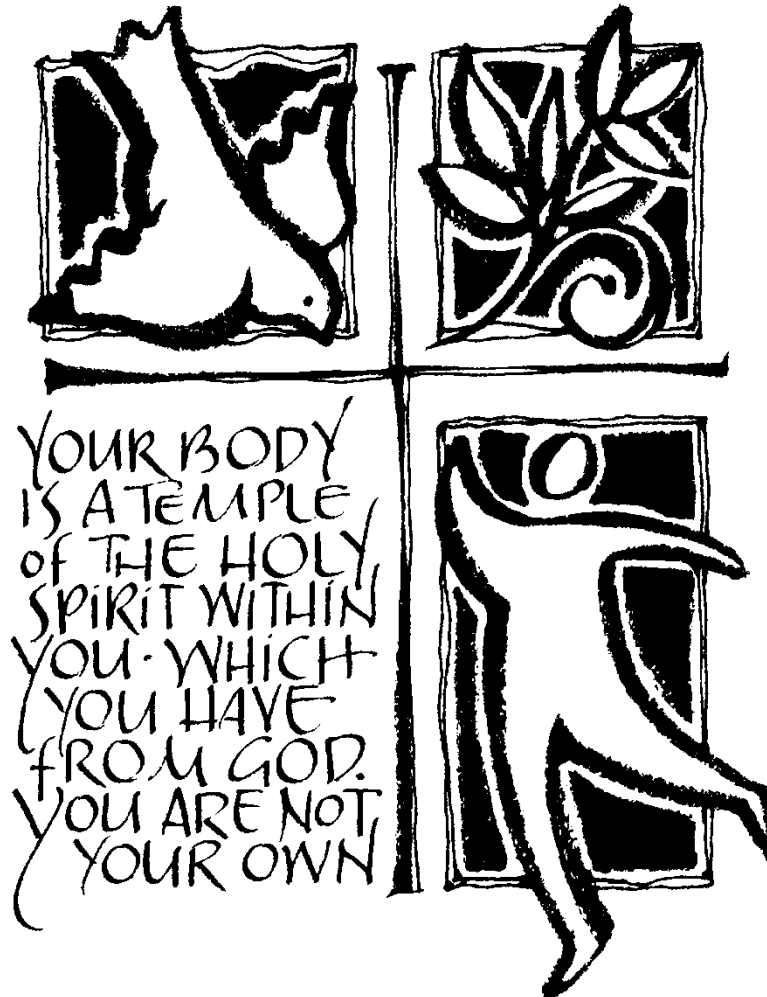

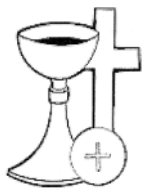

***Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement:** If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.*

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

1 Samuel 3:1-10 (11-20)

The boy Samuel was serving the LORD under Eli. The LORD rarely spoke in those days; a vision didn't happen often. At this time Eli was lying down at his place. His eyes had begun to grow dim, so that he couldn't see. God's lamp hadn't gone out yet, and Samuel was asleep in the house of the LORD where God's ark was kept. Then the LORD called Samuel. "Here I am," he answered. He ran to Eli. "Here I am," he said. "You

called me.” “I didn't call you,” he answered. “Lie down again.” So he went and lay down. The LORD called Samuel again. Samuel got up and went to Eli. “Here I am,” he said. “You called me.” “I didn't call you, my son,” he answered. “Lie down again.” Samuel didn't know the LORD in this way yet, because God hadn't spoken to him yet. The LORD called Samuel a third time. He got up and went to Eli. “Here I am,” he said. “You did call me.” Then Eli realized the LORD was calling the boy. “Go, lie down,” Eli told Samuel. “And now when you're called, say, ‘Speak, LORD, Your servant is listening,’” So Samuel went and lay down at his place. The LORD came and stood there and called as He did before: “Samuel! Samuel!” So Samuel answered, “Speak, Your servant is listening.” “I am going to do something in Israel,” the LORD said, “that will make both ears of everyone who hears it tingle. On that day I will do to Eli everything I said about his family, from the first to the last. And you shall tell him I will condemn his family forever for his guilt: He knew his sons were bringing a curse on themselves, but he didn't restrain them. This is why I swear to Eli's family that no sacrifice or offering will ever wipe out the guilt of Eli's family.” Samuel lay there until the morning. Then he opened the doors of the LORD's house. But Samuel was afraid to tell Eli about the vision. Then Eli called Samuel. “Samuel, my son!” he said. “Here I am,” he answered. “What did He tell you?” he asked. “Please don't hide it from me. May God punish you if you hide from me anything He told you.” So Samuel told him everything and hid nothing from him. He answered, “He is the LORD. May He do what He thinks is right.” Samuel grew, and the LORD was with him and didn't let any of his words go unfulfilled. All Israel from Dan to Beersheba knew Samuel was the LORD's appointed prophet.

EPISTLE LESSON

1 Corinthians 6:12–20

It is permissible for me to do anything, but not everything is beneficial. It is permissible for me to do anything, but I will not allow anything to gain control over my life. Food is for the stomach, and the stomach for food, but God will put an end to both of them. The body is not made for sexual sin but for the Lord; and the Lord is for the body. And God, Who raised the Lord, will also raise us by His power. Don't you know your bodies are members of Christ? Now, should I take the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? Never! Or don't you know he who gives himself to a prostitute is one body with her? The Bible says: “*The two will be one flesh.*” But if you give yourself to the Lord, you are one spirit with Him. Flee from sexual sin. Every other sin a man may do is outside his body. But if he sins sexually, he sins against his own

body. Or don't you know your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit, Whom God gives you and Who is in You? You don't belong to yourselves, because you were bought for a price. Then glorify God with your bodies.
