

#### THE IMPOSITION OF ASHES

Sit

The pastor and assistants receive ashes first, followed by the congregation. Using the right thumb, the pastor or an assistant places the ashes on the forehead of each person in the sign of the cross, saying:

Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.  $[\mathbf{P}]$ 

After receiving the ashes, each person returns to his place in silence.

#### SCRIPTURE LESSONS

"Right now," says the LORD, "return to Me with all your hearts, with fasting, weeping, and mourning." Tear your hearts and not your clothes, and turn to the LORD your God because He is gracious, merciful, slow to get angry, full of kindness, and relents from disaster. Who knows - He may relent and leave behind Him a blessing – gifts of food and drink for the LORD your God? Blow the horn in Zion, order a holy fast, call a solemn meeting. Gather the people, sanctify the congregation, get the elders together, gather the little children, even those who are nursing. Have the bridegroom leave his room, and the bride her chamber. Have the priests, the LORD's servants, weep between the porch and the altar. Have them say: "Spare Your people, LORD, and don't let Your inheritance be disgraced and mocked among the nations. Why should any of the nations ask, 'Where is their God?'" Then the LORD was zealous for His country and took pity on His people. The LORD answered His people: "Now I'm sending you fresh grain, new wine, and olive oil, until you are satisfied. And I will no longer let you be a disgrace among the nations."

#### **Epistle Lesson**

2 Corinthians 5:20b-6:10

Therefore we are ambassadors for Christ. God is pleading through us. We ask you for Christ, "Be reunited with God." God made Him Who did not know sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we would have the righteousness of God.

As men who are working with God we plead with you: Don't let God's grace be wasted on you. He says:

At a favorable time I have heard you; On the day of salvation I have helped you. Look, now is the favorable time. Look, now is the day of salvation.

We're not in any way giving people a reason to turn away, to keep them from finding fault with our work. Instead we're in everything showing we're God's good workers by great endurance in suffering, in need, and in hardships; when we're beaten or put in prison, when there are riots; when we're overworked and go without sleep and food; by being pure, by knowledge, by patience and kindness; by the Holy Spirit; by sincere love; by telling the truth; by God's power; with the weapons of righteousness in the right hand and the left; when we're honored or dishonored, blamed or praised. Treated as deceivers, we are honest;

as unknown, we are well known; as dying, and you see, we go on living, as corrected but not killed; as sad, we're always glad; as beggars, we're making many rich; as having nothing, we really have everything.

Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21

"Be careful not to do your good works before people to be seen by them. If you do, your Father in heaven will not reward you. So when you give to the poor, don't blow your horn, as hypocrites do in the synagogues and on the streets to be praised by people. I tell you, that's really all the reward they'll get. When you give to the poor, don't let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, that your giving may be secret. Then your Father, Who sees what is secret, will reward you." 
#### **Luther's Evening Prayer**
