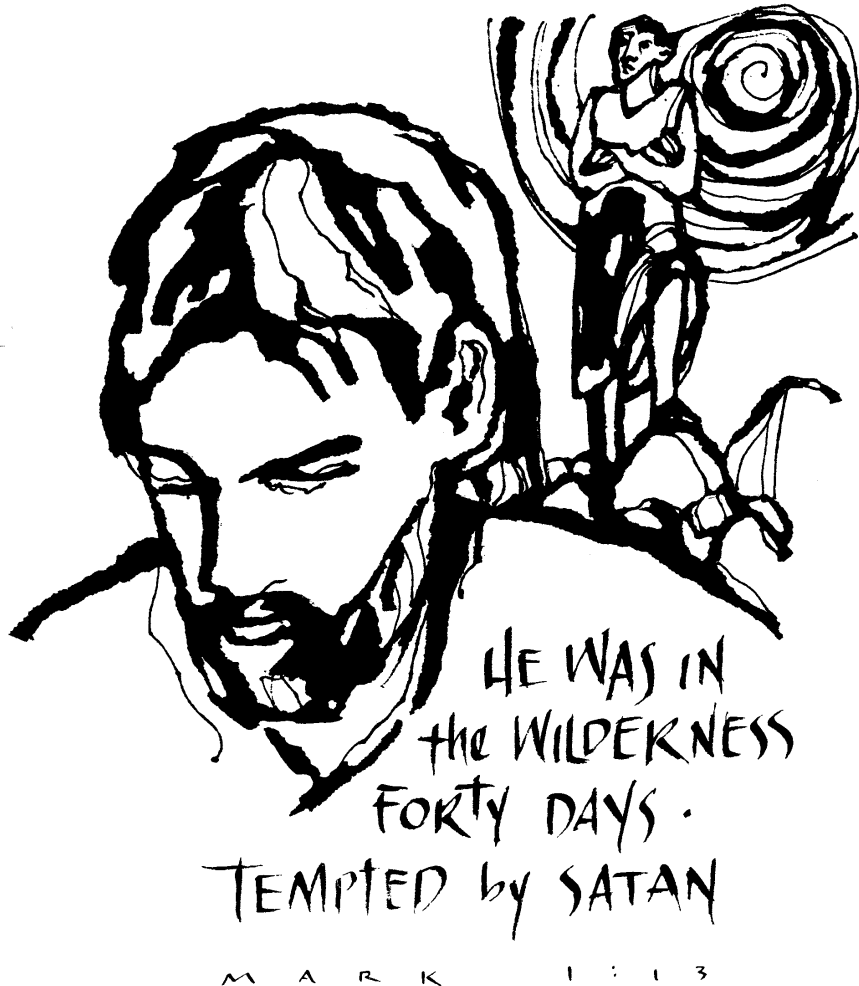

Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

Communion Note: For those who need assistance with the cup please hold out your hand and the Elder will hand it to you. Please place cup in buckets at end of rail when finished.

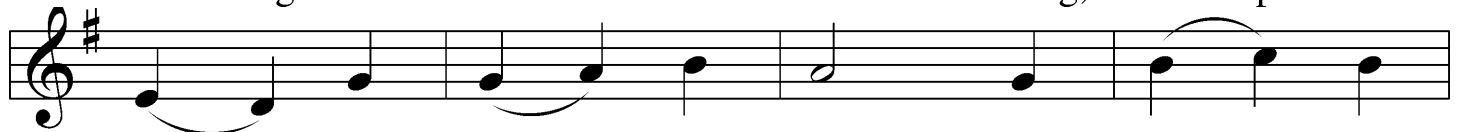

Christ Jesus Defeats Our Temptation and Saves Us by His Faithfulness

Genesis 22:1–18 ~ James 1:12–18 ~ Mark 1:9–15

In faith and the fear of God, Abraham prepared to sacrifice his beloved son, Isaac. At the Word of the Lord, he *“took the wood of the burnt offering and laid it on Isaac his son.”* And *“when they came to the place of which God had told him,”* Abraham bound Isaac *“and laid him on the altar”* (Gen. 22:6, 9). Then God stayed Abraham’s hand and provided *“for himself the lamb for a burnt offering”* (Gen. 22:8). That Lamb is God’s own beloved Son, Jesus, in whom *“all the nations of the earth”* are blessed (Gen. 22:18). As the Substitute for all the sons of men, Jesus is driven by the Spirit *“into the wilderness”* to be *“tempted by Satan”* (Mark 1:12–13) in order to endure and defeat all temptation. We are tempted by our own desire, which conceives and *“gives birth to sin”* (James 1:14–15). But this blessed Man, Christ Jesus, remained *“steadfast under trial,”* and He has received *“the crown of life, which God has promised to those who love him”* (James 1:12). His faithfulness, His victory and His life are now given to us by His grace in the Gospel.

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Genesis 22:1-18

After this God *tested Abraham*. “Abraham!” God said to him. “Yes,” he answered. “Take your *only son Isaac, whom you love,*” He said. “Go to the country of Moriah, and *sacrifice* him there as a burnt offering on one of the hills I will point out to you.” Early the next morning Abraham harnessed his donkey. He took two of his servants and his son Isaac with him. He cut the wood for the burnt offering. Then he started out for the place God told him about. On the third day Abraham looked and saw the place in the distance. Then Abraham said to his servants, “Stay here with the donkey. I and the boy will go over there and worship. Then we'll come back to you.” Abraham took the wood for the burnt offering and laid it on his son Isaac while he took the fire and the knife in his hands. And both were walking together. Then Isaac said to his father, “My father.” “Yes, my son,” he answered. “We have the fire and the wood,” said Isaac, “but where is the sheep for the burnt offering?” “God will provide Himself with a sheep for the burnt offering, my son,” Abraham answered. And so both walked on together. When they came to the place God had mentioned, *Abraham* built the altar there and arranged the wood. Then he bound *his son Isaac* and laid him on the wood *on the altar*. As *Abraham* reached for the knife and took it in his hand to *sacrifice his son*, the Angel of the LORD called to him from heaven, “Abraham! Abraham!” “Yes,” he answered. “Don't lay your hands on the boy,” He said, “and don't do anything to him. Now I know you fear God: you didn't refuse to give Me your *only son.*” When Abraham looked around, he saw behind him a ram caught by his horns in a bush. So

Abraham went and got the ram and sacrificed him as a burnt offering instead of his son. Abraham called that place The-LORD-Will-Provide. Today we still say, "On the mount of the LORD it will be provided." Again the Angel of the LORD called to Abraham from heaven: "I swear by Myself, says the LORD, because you did this and didn't refuse to give up your only son, I will bless you richly and give you many descendants, like the stars in the sky and the sand on the seashore, and your descendants will capture the city of their enemies. In your Descendant all the nations on earth will be blessed, because you did what I told you."

EPISTLE LESSON

James 1:12-18

Blessed is the man who endures patiently when he is tested. When he passes the test, he will receive the crown of life God promised those who love Him. When you're tempted, don't say, "God is tempting me." God can't be tempted to do wrong, and He doesn't tempt anyone. Everyone's own desire tempts him, draws him away, and tries to trap him. When desire conceives, it gives birth to sin, and when sin grows up, it gives birth to death. Don't make a mistake, my dear Christian friends. Every good and perfect gift comes down from above, from the Father of lights, with Whom there is no variation or shifting shadow. As He wanted it, He gave birth to us by the Word of truth so we would be the first and best of His creatures.

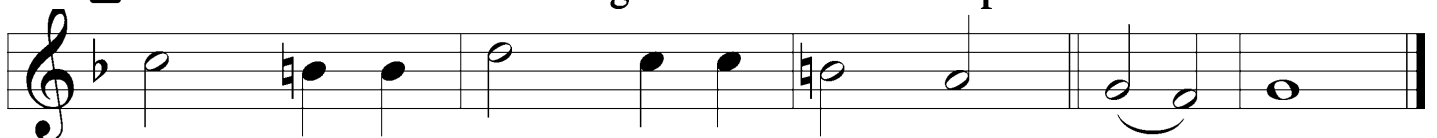

Mark 1:13 - “And he was with the wild animals, and the angels were ministering to him.” God the Father cares for Jesus even in the midst of His temptation in the wilderness. God cares for us in every situation as well. Jesus realized this and always acted from the basis of trust in God the Father’s provision. This is likewise the basis for our life lived in Christ: God cares for us, so we need not act out of fear or greed.

Life Quotes from Lutherans for Life:

The Lord God forbid father Abraham from sacrificing his boy Isaac (Genesis 22:12). The lesson extends to us, too. Abortion is immoral because it is unnecessary. Jesus alone serves as beast of burden in the solemn rite of righting wrongs (Mark 1:13). Death always hatches from sin (James 1:15), but we belong in the business of redemption. If God’s forgiveness forgets even abortion (Psalm 25:7), we ought to forget about it also.
