

Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome

to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

Communion Note: For those who need assistance with the cup please hold out your hand and the Elder will hand it to you. *Please place cup in buckets at end of rail when finished*.



By the Cross of Our Lord Jesus, We Inherit Life Everlasting with God

Genesis 17:1–7, 15–16 ~ Romans 5:1–11 ~ Mark 8:27–38

In His covenant with Abraham, the Lord promised to be with him, to bless him and to make him "the father of a multitude of nations." It is "an everlasting covenant" in Christ Jesus, the seed of Abraham who is blameless before God Almighty. All who believe in this Lord Jesus are the offspring of Abraham and are blessed "throughout their generations" (Gen. 17:1–7), because the Christ has suffered many things. He was rejected and killed, and after three days He rose again (Mark 8:31). To comprehend this theology of the cross, we must set our minds "on the things of God," and not "on the things of man" (Mark 8:33). "God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Rom. 5:8). Therefore, having been "reconciled to God by the death of his Son," much more "shall we be saved by his life" (Rom. 5:10). Baptized into His cross and resurrection, "we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ," and by faith we rejoice in the hope of His glory (Rom. 5:1–2).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

When Abram was 99, the LORD appeared to him. "I am God Almighty," He told Abram. "Live before Me and be perfect. And I will make My covenant with you, and I will make you the father of very many people." Then Abram bowed down to the ground, and God told him: "This is My covenant with you: You will be the father of many nations, and you will no more be called Abram [High Father] but Abraham [Father of Many], because *I made you a father of many nations*. I will give you *very many descendants and make nations* of you, and kings will come from you. I will keep My covenant *with you and with your descendants* after you in their generations—an everlasting covenant it will be. *I will be* your *God* and the God of your descendants.

"Don't call your wife Sarai," God told Abraham; "her name is now Sarah [Princess]. I will bless her and by her give you a son; I will bless her, and she will be the mother of nations and of kings of people."

EPISTLE LESSON

Romans 5:1-11

Genesis 17:1-7, 15-16

Now that we have been declared righteous through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, Who gave us access to God's grace, in which we stand. We boast in the hope of God's glory. More than that, we also boast of our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces patient endurance, and patient endurance produces a genuine Christian character; and a genuine Christian character produces

hope. In this *hope we're not disappointed*, because the Holy Spirit, Who has been given to us, poured God's love into our hearts. At the right time, while we were still helpless, Christ died for the ungodly. A man will hardly die for a righteous person; oh, for a kind person someone may dare to die. But God shows how He loves us by this, that while we were still sinners Christ died for us. Now that His blood has declared us righteous, we are all the more certain He will save us from God's anger. If while we were His enemies we were made God's friends by the death of His Son, now that we are His friends we are all the more certain He will save us by His life. More than that, we rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, Who has now given us this friendship. *Blessed* creatures.

Then Jesus and His disciples went to the villages around Caesarea Philippi. On the way He asked His disciples, "Who do people say I am?" "John the Baptizer," they answered Him. "Others say Elijah, and still others, one of the prophets." "But who do you say I am?" He asked them. "You are the Christ!" Peter answered Him. He warned them not to tell anyone about Him. Then He was teaching them: "The Son of Man has to suffer much, be rejected by the elders, the ruling priests, and the Bible scholars, be killed, and then rise on the third day." He was speaking quite frankly. But Peter took Him aside and started to correct Him. Turning, He looked at His disciples and corrected Peter. "Get behind Me, Satan!" He said. "You're not thinking what God thinks but what men

think." He called the people as well as His disciples. "If you want to follow Me," He told them, "deny yourself, take up your cross, and come with Me. If you want to save your soul, you will lose it. But if you will lose your soul for Me and for the good news, you will save it. What good does it do you to win the whole world and lose your soul? Or what would you give to buy back your soul? If in this unfaithful and sinful generation you're ashamed of Me and what I say, then the Son of Man will be ashamed of you when He comes with the holy angels in His Father's glory.
