The Risen Christ Has Swallowed Up Death Forever!

Isaiah 25:6-9 ~ 1 Corinthians 15:1-11 ~ Mark 16:1-8

The entire fallen world is veiled in a funeral shroud "that is spread over all nations" and "cast over all peoples" (Is. 25:7). But the Lord of hosts, in the Person of the incarnate Son, Jesus Christ, has removed that terrible pall and swallowed up death forever. By submitting Himself to death, He burst it apart from the inside out. Now He wipes away all tears from our faces, and He invites us to "be glad and rejoice in his salvation" (Is. 25:9). His body and His blood, crucified and risen, are given and poured out for us as a feast "of rich food full of marrow, of aged wine well refined" (Is. 25:6). We enter that feast through Holy Baptism, whereby our old man is buried with Jesus Christ, and we are raised up in Him, "dressed in a white robe" of His perfect righteousness (Mark 16:5). What St. Paul and the other apostles received "by the grace of God" is also "delivered to you" by the preaching of Christ, "in which you stand, and by which you are being saved" (1 Cor. 15:1–11).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Isaiah 25:6-9

On this mountain the LORD of armies will prepare for all people a banquet of rich foods, a festival with wines kept on their sediment, rich foods full of marrow, wines kept on their sediment and filtered. On this mountain He will

remove the veil of grief covering all people and the web covering all nations. He will swallow up death forever, and the Lord GOD will wipe away tears from all faces. He will remove the disgrace of His people from the whole world; for the LORD has said so. On that day they will say: "This is our God; we look to Him to save us. This is the LORD we wait for. EPISTLE LESSON

1 Corinthians 15:1-11

My fellow Christians, I am telling you the good news I brought you and you accepted. You stand in it and are saved by it if you cling to the words I used in telling it to you - unless you were trifling when you believed. I brought you what I received - something very important - that Christ died for our sins as the Scriptures said He would, He was buried, and He rose on the third day as the Scriptures said He would. Peter saw Him, then the twelve, then more than 500 Christians at one time; most of these are still living, but some have gone to their rest. Then James saw Him, then all the apostles. Last of all I saw Him, I who was like one prematurely born, since I am the least of the apostles and not fit to be called an apostle because I persecuted God's church. God's grace made me what I am, and His grace wasn't wasted on me. But I did far more work than all the others - not I but God's grace that was with me. Now, whether I did it or they, this is what we preach, and this is what you believed.


