Jesus, the Good Shepherd, Lays Down His Life for the Sheep Acts 4:1-12 ~ 1 John 3:16-24 ~ John 10:11-18

The Lord Jesus is "the good shepherd" who "lays down his life for the sheep" (John 10:11). His life is not taken from Him, but He lays it down willingly, of His own accord, because He

knows and loves the sheep. As the One sent by the Father, He has the "authority to lay it down" and the "authority to take it up again" (John 10:18). So has He done, and now He continues to love and serve as the Good Shepherd of the sheep by the voice of His Gospel. He thus calls all people into the fold of His Church, so that there may be "one flock, one shepherd" (John 10:16). That is why the apostles "were teaching the people and proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection from the dead" (Acts 4:2). Since "there is salvation in no one else," His voice rings out to this day through the preaching of His name, "for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12). His voice comforts our hearts against all condemnation and gives us courage to "love one another" and "to lay down our lives for the brothers," as He laid down His life for us (1 John 3:16, 23).

FIRST LESSON Acts 4:1-12

While they were talking to the people, the priests, the captain of the temple, and the Sadducees stepped up to them, much annoyed because they were teaching the people and preaching that in Jesus the dead rise. They arrested them, and since it was already evening, they put them in prison until the next day. But many of those who had heard the Word believed, and the number of the men grew to about 5,000. The next day their rulers, elders, and Bible scholars met in Jerusalem with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, Alexander, and all the others of the high priest's family. And they had the two men stand before them. "By what power or name did you do this?" they asked. Then Peter was filled with the Holy Spirit. "Rulers of the people and elders," he said to them, "if we're questioned today about helping a crippled man, how he was made well, all of you and all the people of Israel should know this man stands healthy before you by the name of Jesus Christ from Nazareth, Whom you crucified but God raised from the dead. He is the Stone rejected by you builders and has become the Cornerstone. No one else can save us, because in all the world there is only one name given us by which we must be saved."

EPISTLE LESSON

1 John 3:16-24

This is how we learned what love is: He gave His life for us. We, too, should give our lives for our fellow Christians. If anyone has this world's goods and sees his fellow Christian is in need but shuts his heart against him, how can he still be loving God?

Children, let us not love only in words or in talk, but let us put our love into action and make it real. This is how we'll know we're born of the truth and will reassure ourselves before Him: Whenever our conscience condemns us, God is greater than our conscience and knows everything. Dear friends, if our conscience doesn't condemn us, we can talk boldly to God and get from Him anything we ask because we keep His commandments and do what pleases Him. He orders us to believe in the name of His Son Jesus Christ and to love one another as He has ordered us to do. Anyone who keeps His commandments lives in God and God in him. And this is how we know He lives in us: by the Spirit Whom He has given us.

John 10:11-18




