

#### The Risen Christ Breathes His Peace in the Holy Absolution Acts 4:32–35 ~ 1 John 1:1–2:2 ~ John 20:19–31

The crucified and risen Lord Jesus appeared to His apostles on the first Easter Sunday. He "came and stood among them," and with His Word and the wounds in "his hands and his side," He granted them His peace (John 20:19–20). He sent them as ministers of the Gospel in His name to bestow the life-giving Holy Spirit for us and for His whole Church through the forgiveness of sins (John 20:21–23). Through this apostolic ministry, He calls us to believe that He "is the Christ, the Son of God," so that by such faith we "may have life in his name" (John 20:31). The apostles "have seen and heard" this divine life manifested in the flesh of Christ, and those who succeed them in this apostolic ministry now proclaim that same Absolution to us, so that we "too may have fellowship" with the risen Christ, with the apostles and "with one another" (1 John 1:1–7). The one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church lives by "their testimony to the resurrection of the

Lord Jesus," and all who believe this Word are "of one heart and soul," because in Him they truly have "everything in common" (Acts 4:32–33).

#### FIRST LESSON

The whole group of believers was one in heart and soul. And no one called anything he had his own, but they shared everything. With great power the apostles told the truth that the Lord Jesus had risen, and much good will rested on all of them. None of them was in need, because all who had land or houses would sell them and bring the money they got for them and lay it at the apostles' feet. Then it was distributed to each one as he needed it.

### **EPISTLE LESSON**

1 John 1:1-2:2

Acts 4:32-35

IT WAS THERE FROM THE BEGINNING, we heard It, we saw It with our eyes, we looked at It, and our hands touched It—we're writing about the Word of Life. That Life showed Itself and we saw It, and now we testify and tell you about the everlasting Life that was with the Father and showed Itself to us. We saw and heard It, and we tell you about It so that you, too, will have It in fellowship with us. Our fellowship is with the Father and with His Son Jesus Christ. We're writing this so that our joy may be complete. This is what we heard Him tell us and we're telling you: God is Light, and there is nothing dark in Him. If we say we share what He has but live in the dark, we're lying and not living the truth. If we live in the light as He is in the light, we have it in fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, His Son, washes us clean from every sin. If we say we don't have any sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth isn't in us. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just, to forgive our sins and wash us clean from all unrighteousness. If we say we haven't sinned, we make Him a liar, and His Word is not in us.

My children, I'm writing this to you to keep you from sinning. If anyone sins, we have One to plead for us with the Father—Jesus Christ, Who is righteous. He is the payment for our sins, and not for ours only but for the whole world.

## HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

John 20:19-31

**P** The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the twentieth chapter.

Glory be to Thee, O Lord. (sing)

That Sunday evening the doors were locked where the disciples were, because they were afraid of the Jews. Then Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace to you!" When He said this, He showed them His hands and His side. Then the disciples were delighted to see the Lord.

"Peace to you!" Jesus said to them again. "As the Father sent Me, so I send you." When He had said this, He breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whenever you forgive sins, they are forgiven; whenever you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven."

But Thomas, one of the twelve, who was called Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We saw the Lord." "Unless I see the marks of the nails in His hands," he told them, "and put my finger in the marks of the nails and put my hand in His side, I won't believe it."

A week later His disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. The doors were locked, but Jesus came and stood among them. "Peace to you!" He said. Then He told Thomas, "Put your finger here, and look at My hands - and take your hand and put it in My side. And don't doubt but believe."

"My Lord and my God!" Thomas answered Him.

"Do you believe because you've seen Me?" Jesus asked him. "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

His disciples saw Jesus do many other miracles that are not written in this book. But these things are written so that you believe Jesus is the Christ, God's Son, and by believing have life in His name.


